### General Medicine Wards

- General Medicine Services: 3 teams
  - Severn & Chesapeake Services: 1 senior residents, 3 intern residents, students until September. Then 1 senior, 2 interns, medical students
  - Magothy service: 2 senior residents, medical students
  - Night Float: 2 senior residents, one intern
- Rounding census ~15 per service team.
- Drip-distribution admissions system

### Admitter Rotation

- 2 senior residents
- 1 resident takes admissions for all 3 GMS teams (along with medical students and team interns)
- 1 resident is assigned to cover the GMS team senior off days

### Intensive Care Unit

- Closed, mixed ICU model
- 5 internal medicine residents (overlap with Surgery & OB/Gyn residents)
- Daily multidisciplinary rounds (Intensivists, Residents, Pharmacists, RNs, NPs, PAs, ethicist,...etc.) on a wide array of complex pathology
- 24/7 on-site intensivist(s)
- Simulation lab and procedure training/workshop
- Available opportunities for procedures
- Additional ICU didactics by intensivists

## **Advanced Internal Medicine Clinic – Luminis Health Primary Care**

- Comprehensive primary care clinic with opportunity for many new patients
- 4+1 model
- In-Person Pharmacy Staff Support
- Specialty clinics assigned during clinic week (rheumatology, endocrinology, hematology/oncology, psychiatry, anticoagulation clinic)
- Resident of the Day – Administrative Duties
- Urgent care
- Telemedicine
- Preoperative evaluation
- Full electronic medical records training, prescribing, and billing
- Ambulatory Academic half day each week
- 4 Half days each clinic week for administrative time, wellness, and doctors' appointments
